The Diocese of Sheffield Academies Trust is committed to the view that each child is unique and of infinite value to God.

1. Aims of the Accessibility Plan

This plan outlines how St Alban's CE Primary School aims to increase access to education for pupils with disabilities in the three areas required by the planning duties in the Equality Act 2010.

Through this plan we aim to:

- Increase the extent to which pupils with disabilities can participate in the curriculum.
- Improve the physical environment of the school to enable pupils with disabilities to take better advantage of education, benefits, facilities and services provided.
- Improve the availability of accessible information to pupils with disabilities. (i.e. the curriculum, physical environment and information).

The above aims will be delivered within a reasonable timeframe, and in ways which are determined after taking into account pupils' disabilities and the views of parents and pupils. In the preparation of an accessibility strategy, the LA must have regard to the need to allocate adequate resources in the implementation of this strategy.

Definition of Disability

"A person has a disability if he /she has a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long- term adverse effect on his/her ability to carry out normal day to day activities"

Disability Discrimination Act – 1995 (DDA)

The Trust (DSAT) and governing board also recognises its responsibilities towards employees with disabilities and will:

- Monitor recruitment procedures to ensure that individuals with disabilities are provided with equal opportunities.
- Provide appropriate support and provision for employees with disabilities to ensure that they can carry out their work effectively without barriers.
- Undertake reasonable adjustments to enable staff to access the workplace.

The plan will be resourced, implemented, reviewed and revised in consultation with:

- Pupils' parents.
- The Executive Headteacher, Head of School and other relevant members of staff.
- Governors and the Local School Board (LSB).
- External partners.



2. Key principles

Our School recognises its duty under the Equality Act 2010:

- Not to discriminate against disabled pupils in their admissions and exclusions, and provision of education and associated services
- Not to treat disabled pupils less favourably
- To take reasonable steps to avoid putting disabled pupils at a substantial disadvantage
- To publish an Accessibility Plan

In performing their duties, governors and staff will have regard to SEND Code of Practice.

St Alban's CE Primary School:

- Recognises and values the parent's knowledge of their child's disability and its effect on his/her ability
- Respects the parent's and child's right to confidentiality
- The academy provides all students with a broad and balanced curriculum, differentiated and adjusted to meet the needs of individual students and their preferred learning style, by:
 - setting suitable learning challenges
 - responding to students' diverse learning needs
 - overcoming potential barriers to learning and assessment for individual and groups of students.
 - endorsing the key principles in the National Curriculum Framework

This plan will contribute to the review of the school development plan and to related school policies

including:

- Equal Opportunities Policy
- Teaching and Learning Policy

3. Review

This document will be reviewed annually, but may be reviewed and updated more frequently if necessary.

It will be approved by the Local School Board.

5. Provision

The plan below outlines the main provisions and actions that the school has made and is planning to make, to achieve the key objectives linked to Curriculum, the environment and policies and initiatives including improvements to the delivery of information to pupils with a disability.

Planning duty 1: Curriculum

Teachers understand the different SEND issues in their classes and can make informed decisions about the more effective use of teaching assistants. Teachers plan and monitor the use of interventions.
Share good practice relating to disability issues and data.	SENDCo	Ongoing when needs and strengths are identified	Precise and well-planned teaching and learning takes place in place in all classrooms and SEND pupils make good progress in line or above their peers.
Monitoring of teachers' practice will include careful consideration 'reasonable adjustments' made.	EHT/HOS SENDCo	Ongoing weekly and half termly monitoring of provision and practice in classrooms.	Precise and well-planned teaching and learning takes place in place in all classrooms, which allows SEND pupils to fully access the curriculum. Pupils with SEND therefore make good progress in line with their peers.
Audit of staff training needs	HOS SENDCo	Termly meeting between SENDCo and EHT/HOS to collate evidence and make informed choices about future development for staff.	Professional development is relevant and purposeful. Consistently good teaching is in place and SEND children have their needs met through the curriculum. SEND pupils reach their targets.

Carry out premises audit with attention to: lighting, signage, fire alarms, acoustic environment, floor coverings, heating and ventilation, accessible and clean toileting, washing and changing facilities; accessibility of outside areas – playground, field, walkways into school	Premises Manager and Trust Buildings Manager	Termly Annual Audit	The environment is fully accessible and is maintained to a very good standard.
Consider as part of the audit the provision of ramps, disabled parking, lifts and improvements to doorways; the provision of furniture and apparatus to improve access.	Premises Manager and Trust Buildings Manager	Termly Annual Audit	The environment is fully accessible and is maintained to a very good standard
Plan for and act on the recommendations from the audit, as far as possible and reasonable within the School's budget. (Further actions to be developed following audit).	Premises Manager and Trust Buildings Manager Local board member.	Termly Annual Audit	The environment is fully accessible and is maintained to a very good standard

Behaviour Policy Review: ensure the policy supports all children to learn in a safe and supportive environment, adapting the policy when necessary to meet a range of complex needs. Include information and key documents on School website/learning platform	HOS	Annually	The website is compliant and informative
Include aspects of Disability Equality in assemblies and worship	HOS	Long term plan reflects frequent reference to protected characteristics across each term, including disability.	Children develop a good understanding of equality through topics covered and resources used.
